He will be attending as the PCM/SEL representative on the International Commission for the Laity in Carmel and also as one of the keynote speakers. He will be speaking on "Challenges that Face The Carmelite Third Order as We Begin the New Millennium."

Our Province was well represented at the Carmelite Psychologists Symposium in Rome during the second half of February. Carmelites **Dominic Savino**, **Hank Ormond**, and **Quinn Conners** each produced a paper for delivery at the international symposium. These papers will be published at a later date.

The Prior General, **Joseph Chalmers, O. Carm.**, gave a talk entitled "The Priest: Man of Prayer, Called to Pray" on February 13 at the Diocese of Salford (England) Ongoing Formation for Priests.
